The prices received to deck Witton-le-Wear platform in GRP are rather prohibitive (£7k & £29k) so this isn't going to be a straightforward fix.

We've had quotes to complete No.40's boiler. If we can go ahead with this it is realistic that she can be working again late summer 2016

7 Treasurer's report

As at the end of April the current account shows a small positive balance. This is due to the transfer of funds from the current account to savings accounts to maximise interest earned.

Current account at Barclays stands at £4085, deposits at the Darlington Building Society £27k of which £18.8k is the loan from Gerry Mudd.

10 Secretary Report

Correspondence:

A response to the letter sent to to formally apologise on behalf of the Trust for the loss of his VHS Video Tape has been received from the tapes owner. In the letter the tape owner expresses his displeasure at the way the Trust has mislaid his property and the total disregard to the assurances made by Trust Officers to safeguard the videotape. Further, he has also expressed his displeasure that unauthorised copies were taken of the video and distributed as a promotional DVD. The tape owner declined the offer of Life Membership of the Trust as recompense.

Following a request for Heritage Service information from a member, a copy of the 2015 timetable/brochure has need mailed out.

It was noted that the interaction between the travelling public and the Trust volunteer on train staff the on-going education is again contributing to our public benefit obligations.

There were no Equal Opportunities/Anti-discrimination/ Trust activities which meet our public benefit items to report.

11 Heritage Services

The Heritage Services continue at a steady rate. The number of passengers travelling daily is significantly affected by the weather with numbers down on poor weather days. Income to date is £4766 and expenditure £1295 but this excludes the 122 hire charges for March, April and May. This outstanding expenditure will be paid in the next few days.

Evan Green Hughes has agreed to undertake routine FTR exams for the unit now that CIC Engineering Manager is no longer available. As part of this Kevin Richardson is to be trained to ultimately undertake routine examinations.

A potential second DMU set has been identified to provide alternative traction to the 122 unit to allow time for maintenance

A special train was run for a party of walkers between Wolsingham and Stanhope with beer provided as refreshment. The trip was a great success with the walkers being very satisfied with the service provided. The charter fee and donations provided a sizable sum to the Trusts coffers.

A cost analysis for the extension of the service to Witton-le-Wear is to be drawn up to determine the feasibility of such a project.

12 No 40 Report

Two quotes have been received for the work to complete the boiler for No 40. One from Adam Dalgleish and the second from H A McEwen. Both are in the order of £50,000 but there are differences in the work schedules. A third quote is to be sought.

13 Projects/Restoration Activities

There have been a request to provide a 240 volt AC electrical supply to the 1st class carriage Nina to facilitate lighting and heating whilst the coach is being used as additional seating for the café.

The Sunday gang are clearing the vegetation along and above the retaining wall at Wolsingham Station. The Saunston family who have adopted Wolsingham Station are prepared to undertake painting and restoration of the fences etc.

A replacement receiver unit to activate the shutter roller door is available for £100. This would provide a number of suitable transponders that could be held by responsible individuals and remove the need to collect the current single transponder from Stanhope Station every time access if require to Wolsingham Station Cabin.

15 Weardale Railway Trust Activities

There was a Railitzer event in conjunction with the NETOA on the 16th May a number of Trust members attended. A voiceover was provided for two films that featured the railway. The first was Stanhope to Bishop Auckland West in 3 minutes, taken from the back cab of the 141 unit. The second was of a steam trial for No40 from lighting up to running outside of the Depot.

The WRHSL Commercial manager is to be requested to provide a comprehensive list of all the summers planned activities,

The Trust website has been unchanged for several months and changeover to the new site needs to be progressed. All Council members to review the old website and advise Ruth as to which content should be taken over onto the new site together with any additional material that is required.

16 Weardale Railway CIC reports.

Means of increasing the CIC income was discussed at the management meeting. Currently the only income generated for the Company is from Polar Express and the café. It is proposed that a CIC Marketing Team is established. The possibility of attracting rail tours onto the line is being explored.

At a previous meeting Ruth Carroll had been nominated as a Trust representative on the CIC Board. Gerry Mudd has indicated that he is standing down as one of the Trust members on the CIC Board. Nominations for a replacement will be discussed at the next Council meeting.

17 Other reports from Trust Directors

17a Weekly Lottery/Fund Raising

Take up of the new Lottery has been slow with 6 members to date. The possibility of putting the Lottery application form on the Trust website is to be explored. It is proposed that the application form will be included in the next copy of BTL to give the membership the opportunity to participate.
