# 6 Chairman's Report

There was no Chairmans Report for the meeting.

#### 7 Treasurer's report

Firstly, thanks to The Secretary for looking after the finances in our absence particularly as this was an active time and everything was documented.

It is a peak time for membership renewals and they have come in steadily, many with donations too. We have at least stopped receiving letters declining renewed membership of the Trust because of the inactivity on the line. We have had a successful Easter draw as well.

The main expense this month has been the repair to Stanhope station roof of £3000. However with the lack of spending on No 40, our balances increased by £400 this month and generally over our year.

There is £2000 in the Restricted funds for Witton–le-Wear station should a project to extend operations to Witton be considered.

The financial figure had been circulated to Directors prior to the meeting.

It is clear though, that we do not have the resources to do everything we would like. We do not yet know what No 40 will now cost to complete, but it will be much more than we were contemplating and there will be more delay. We should look at our subscriptions just to keep pace with routine costs.

The increased costs of production of the Trust quarterly magazine (BTL) and postage means that the current membership subscriptions barely cover the costs. Consideration should be given to looking to increase the membership subscription fee in the future.

An interim lease for Stanhope Station has been signed with the Trust holding the tenancy. DCC continue to be responsible insuring the building structure. The Trust need to come to some formal arrangement with the CIC to define the extent of the CIC usage.

# 9 Secretary's' Report

The Secretary reported that the Directors details had been updated at Companies House. The Financial Director and Treasurer had submitted the Trust Annual Accounts. The Trust Annual Return is due in August 2015.

## 10 Heritage Services

There have been 14 operating days to date in this our second season of operation. So far £2865.00 has been taken in fares which is an average £204.64 per day. Expenses paid to date are £1,295.00 for leaflets and £30 for Weardale Visitor Network membership. Mileage charges for the Hire of the 122 Bubblecar are still to be calculated and paid for.

The first fill of diesel is ordered for Thursday 30th April - £262.50

There are 2 special trains booked -1 at £100 for a party of walkers between Wolsingham and Stanhope and 1 at £140 for a private birthday celebration. These are both non timetabled services and the prices cover expenses and include a modest profit.

Saturday 16<sup>th</sup> May joint venture with North East Theatre Organ Association. An evening of film and music with a railway theme, including the Weardale Railway.

Vintage car rally planned for NEMMOC at Stanhope. Discount fare structure to be agreed.

Discounted fare scheme agreed with South Tynedale Railway and Killhope Lead Mining Centre. On production of a valid 2015 ticket, visitors can claim a discount on rail fares. Similarly, rail travellers can claim a discount at both venues.

The producer of the Heritage Service roster is already experiencing difficulty filling operational roles on some dates. Particularly duty manager and Broadwood. One volunteer is currently covering all unfilled Broadwood dates but would prefer to give some up!

#### 11 No 40 Report

An inspection of the boiler by Boilersmith Adam Dalgleish has estimated a further £45,000 of expenditure is require to complete the refurbishment of the boiler. Estimated timescale to completion is 14 months. A further inspection is planned for Friday the 1<sup>st</sup> May with a provisional estimated delivery before year end. This might present an opportunity to hire number 40 out for Santa Specials over the Christmas period.

Small works to finish the chassis/motion is ongoing.

## 12 Projects/Restoration Activities

There have been no Carriage or Wagon project works this month.

As reported earlier Stanhope Station roof is now repaired at a cost of £3000. Consideration should now be given to the Stanhope Station Platform Canopy and Wolsingham Station Cabin.

# 13 Volunteer and Membership secretary's Report

Volunteer Report

We are now well under way to the start of our second season of a Trust run Heritage service. Our Volunteers have been very busy not only on the Operational Side of this but in Station Maintenance as well. A working party met up at Stanhope to make a start on the tidying for the Season. This is an ongoing process and volunteers are always welcome to come along and help.

As mentioned in previous issues we have Station Adopters at Frosterley - Roy and Ellen Humphries. They spend their free time keeping Frosterley Station neat and tidy. They have just finished painting the white line on the platform edge. At Wolsingham we now have Station Adopters also. The Sauntson family have taken on the responsibility of keeping Wolsingham tidy. They have been carrying on from the work carried out by Debbie and Sue last year. When you are passing Frosterley and Wolsingham why not call in and see the amazing work they have been doing.

PTS. There will be several volunteers requiring PTS refreshment from June onwards. Phil Charlton has several PTS exams/questions which can be used to help carry this out. The initial PTS question paper was created by the CIC General Manager and obviously people will need to do a different paper to be assessed correctly. Whether this takes the form of an oral exam or a full written one is yet to be decided. The paper created by the General Manager could still be used for initial PTS examinations if necessary. This will need to be an in depth course as we assume that volunteers are coming with no initial knowledge.

Medicals. Quite a few people need medicals. Mike Wood will be contacted accordingly..

As predicted March was a really busy month for renewals. We have also had several members changing to Life Membership as well as four new Trust Members.

Membership currently stands at 568.
