2 Minutes of previous meeting

6 Chairman's Report

The Chairman, Richard Maughan gave a brief verbal report.

This month has been spent mulling over what activities the Trust will undertake next year including heritage services. The Shop continues to trade and the Sunday Gang is working hard maintaining the track side vegetation. The Chairman concluded that the priorities for the Trust Council are to decide what the Trust will undertake next year and raise money to finish the restoration of Number 40.

7 Treasurer's report

The Treasurer is away on holiday and no financial report has been issued. Gerry Mudd reviewed how much had been spent on Number 40, the cost of completing Number 40s restoration, how much allocated funds are available and the amount of short fall.

Number 40 estimated final costs - £85,000 (£82,000 plus £3,000 contingency) Paid out to date - £37,000 Outstanding bills to be paid - £20,000 Miscellaneous items - £25,000 (not cash flowed)

Original estimate - £57,000 (for boiler works only)

Need to find £45,000 (£20,000 outstanding bills and miscellaneous £25,000)

Trust reserves - £15,000 Estimated Trust Income in 2014 - £11,000

Gap in funding £10,000- £20,000 (this leaves the Trust will zero reserves).

8 Shop

The Chairman reported that the shop will operate when the station café is open. Richard has spoken to Mike Rapp who has requested that more volunteers are trained to operate the shop. Tony Slack is to ask the TII's if they would be interested in working in the shop.

9 Heritage Services 2014

The Chairman commented on the current situation. Steve Raine discussed the type of operations which could be considered fiscally neutral to the Trust. Steve suggested that an agreement should be in place between the company and the Trust giving details of what services the company will provide to the Trust in-order to operate a service. It was agreed that the Trust writes a letter to the company confirming that the Trust wants to hold discussions about the operation of a heritage service. The Trust Directors need to consider whether they will run the service or contract services with volunteer labour.

The Directors discussed the correspondence between Steve Bissell and Ian Raxton (HMRI) about the Trust operating the service. The Secretary commented that if the Trust wanted to run heritage services for the Trusts benefit (for instance fund raising) this is acceptable under our current legal structure. The Secretary further commented that to protect the Trust from financial problems a separate trading arm should be set up to operate the heritage services.

Steve Raine also suggested that the Trust Directors should have parallel discussions with Durham County Council to update them on the current situation and try to get their support (and financial support). Neil Foster (Tourism and Economic Development) would be the appropriate contact. The following plan was agreed:-

Preliminary step - Speak to Dartmoor about their operating arrangements with BARs.

First step – Meetting with DCC (reminder DCC are a minority shareholder in WRCIC) and explain the Trust thinking behind heritage services

Second step – Speak to or email Ed Ellis about setting up a minority shareholders meeting and discuss the options

- a) WRT contracted with WRCIC to provide equipment to run heritage services.
- b) WRT hires or purchases equipment and runs heritage services.

Third step – Set up heritage service company (possible directors Steve Raine, Kevin Richardson, Tony Slack and Richard Maughan).

John Askwith asked about the Trust heritage operations impinging on WRCIC operations such as War on the Line/Santa Specials. It was commented that WRCIC is not going to operate War on the Line or Santa Specials their operations will consist of Polar Express and dining trains.

10 Number 40

A verbal report was given by Richard Maughan:

Ash pan has been completed and the boiler has been stripped and descaled.

Axle brasses are due next week.

Not much progress to report on the painting of Number 40 due to work being undertaken by WRCIC on a Class 56. The Directors discussed Gerry Mudd fund raising flyer which will inserted into the next BTLs. Other fund raising ideas such as sponsor a tube or different parts of the locomotive were also considered.
