# 6 Chairman's Report

The Chairman gave verbal report. The Chairman highlighted 2 major issues that the Directors need to discuss in detail so that the Directors can decide what future actions the Trust may need to take. The 2 major issues are Volunteering and Number 40. The Chairman highlighted the need for new volunteers, making these new volunteers welcome, inducting and training the new volunteers, rostering the new volunteers and making sure we maintain contact. The Chairman commented that the Directors need to agree a rebuilding plan for Number 40 as in 2011 Number 40 may need a major rebuild subject to the boiler inspectors report.

The Chairman's report was approved by the Directors.

## 7 Treasurer's report

The Treasurer gave a verbal summary of the financial activity during December. Expenditure for the month was £400 however there are 2 invoices outstanding £300 for a spring repair and £3000 for spring hanger machining. Income was £2900, £1239 rate refund from Durham County Council £1000 from Weardale Action Partnership (chainsaw training, funds for painting rolling stock and advertising).

The Treasurers report was approved by the Directors.

#### 8 Secretary's report

No report was presented.

#### 9 Number 40

Malcolm Simpson reported that Number 40 has a leaking tube which has been plugged however 6 more are weeping water which is running down to the brick arch. Alistair Gregory, Mike Fairburn and Steve Race have agreed to undertake a complete boiler re-tube involving the replacement of all 108 tubes (no labour costs). This retubing would be undertaken after the schools half term holiday. Trevor Hewitt has spoken to Mike Freeby who would come up on expenses only basis to provide technical support to the Trust.

Malcolm Simpson reviewed the possible options:

Option 1 - blank up to 10% of the tubes and keep running up to June 2012 boiler inspection (one year extension on the 10 year certificate) assuming Number 40 passes inspection due May 2011.

Option 2 – bring forward the heavy overhaul as 75% of this work has been had been undertaken at Tyseley and assuming the boiler inspector was amenable we could obtain a full 10 year certificate dated from 2008 (date that Tyseley had completed their work).

Issues to be considered: Some of Number 40s boiler stays have 15% wasting - 20% wasting is considered a failure by the boiler inspector and this would require the boiler to be removed. Removing the boiler and completing all the associated works would take about 6 months.

Trevor Hewitt has spoken to the boiler inspector who will review the inspection reports and report back to Trevor on which options would be viewed favourably.

The Directors agreed to authorise Trevor Hewitt to order the tubes and subject to the boiler inspectors views fully re-tube Number 40's boiler after the school half term holiday (after 28<sup>th</sup> February).

The Directors approved this proposal.

Trevor Hewitt reported that he had ordered 12 fire bars however 10 had been invoiced/delivered. G5 coach contract has not been received Steve Raine to send specimen contract to Trevor. Trevor also confirmed that Nina plague had been fitted.

## 11 Volunteering

**Volunteering** – David Million joined the meeting. The Chairman David Scott outlined the current situation about bringing new volunteers into the operation rosters after they have completed their training. Gerry Mudd commented that a volunteer co-ordinator was needed. Trevor Hewitt remarked that currently 140 volunteers needed categorising and offered possible volunteering roles. Michael Wilkinson commented that he had contacted 25 volunteers and 9 had turned up for induction. The Directors discussed the issues of the shop operations and till codes . Dave Million agreed to review the shop issues . Gerry Mudd, Brian Cox and David Scott agreed to work together and contact by phone the volunteers on Trevor's list. David Million agreed to send a welcome letter to any new volunteer. David Million thanked David Scott for his letter on behalf of the Trust thanking the Junior Club for all their hard work.

Depot security - Mike Wood raised the issue of Depot security as the arrangements had not been finalised. As RMS are using the site the depot is now locked securely.

Franking machine – Trevor Hewitt reported that BTL mailing (720 items 4 times a year + 120 other mail items approx 3000 items per year) 2<sup>nd</sup> class mail costs 32p franked mail is 7p less. Neopost is the cheapest with a rental of £6/year. John Askwith/Brian Cox suggested using the Post Office franking service – Trevor to review costs.

Trust Objectives 2011 – John Askwith asked about the status of this document. David Scott agreed to produce a document. John Askwith commented that the Trust needs to set objectives with Director responsibilities. Mike Wood suggested that we should give volunteer roles proper railway titles.
