BISHOP AUCKLAND CONNECTION TO BE REINSTATED No 40: RESTORATION AND APPEAL PROGRESS REPORT VOLUNTEER NUMBERS GROWING

- Network Rail commitment for Bishop Auckland connection: The link between the Weardale Railway and the Network Rail line to Darlington was put out of use some years ago. The reinstatement of this connection has been high on the list of priorities for the new owners. Mark Westerfield has confirmed that the Railway has received an undertaking from Network Rail that the necessary work will be completed before July 31 this year. This will facilitate through running and the transfer of stock to and from the network. (M Westerfield)

Work on the slide bars and realignment of the motion has been completed, the side tanks replaced and the cab sides installed. This coming week should see the cab roof put in position. • **First Aid Course : reminder :** We still need more volunteers who have had first aid training: the next course will take place on Saturday 28th March 09:30 - 16:00 at Bishop Auckland Station.

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- The Track to Bishop Auckland: Weekday work continues: You will all no doubt be aware that we are progressing towards opening the line to Bishop Auckland later this year and that this will be a landmark event in our railway's history and an accolade to all of the volunteers, past and present, that have worked hard to keep the line running. We are now getting help from an increasing number of weekday volunteers. - St Johns Chapel Station: calling all railway modellers: In 1978 six members of the North Durham 4mm Group of the Scalefour Society commenced building a detailed scale model of St Johns Chapel station. ScaleFour is the accurate version of the well known "00" Gauge where all dimensions are to scale the equipment for it is not mass produced so this is a hobby for really skilled modellers. Over the next few years the model was built and exhibited at various shows in the North of England as it was gradually completed. In the eighties the Group had to sell the model and it passed into private ownership. In 2007 the owner offered it to the Trust and it was transferred to Weardale. One of the original modellers has agreed to advise on its restoration which we plan to carry out in the Bishop Auckland Station building. The model is amazingly detailed –all the features: buildings, lines, fences, walls, even the trees, are reproduced exactly to scale as it was in the mid thirties. The railway tracks are made of steel and the rail is soldered to each of the chairs on the accurately reproduced sleepers, 5,000 chairs in all. The model is 30ft long and includes the approaches to the station, the photograph reproduced here includes only a small section near the station and was taken before the model was completed.

• Witton le Wear Crossing: Work on the new gates is nearing completion in the Depot, it is hoped to hang them in the next 2 or 3 weeks. The next volunteer project will be the restoration of the crossing keepers cabin and the reinstatement of an electricity supply for use in the cabin and for the crossing lights. This cabin will need to be occupied each operational day. The first crossing keeper training course of 12 people was fully subscribed. Meanwhile the work by DCC on the lineside footpath towards Bridge 3 continues apace, vegetation clearance is now complete.
