STEAM RETURNS TO THE WEARDALE RAILWAY DMU PERFORMS TEST RUN:- WOLSINGHAM TO WITTON PARK

• **First Steam Hauled Passenger trains coming soon: May 23rd, 24th?** The Trust owned loco, No 40 passed its Fitness to Run test last week, which means the Company can soon take over its operation and can schedule it, as required, on passenger services. The loco has run light engine to Stanhope and back. Some further minor adjustments remain to be carried out, the repainting needs to be completed and further test runs are planned to complete the programme of work. If all goes to plan then the loco will be scheduled on the weekend services on May 23 and 24. Please check the website for confirmation of this nearer the time.

Previously this section was only passable by the Wickham trolley. - HMRI VISIT: 13 May: Work continues, as detailed elsewhere in this report to prepare for the Inspector's visit next week. He asked to travel on the DMU towards Bishop Auckland and at present it looks as if it should be possible to get as far as the Broken Banks area, within a few hundred yards of Bishop Auckland station. The section at Broken banks requires further alignment and re-sleepering and at the moment is only passable by the Whickam. (G Lord)
- **NEWS JUST IN**: 141 travels from Wolsingham to Witton Park: The first full gauge train movement over this section of track took place today (May 8th) when the DMU travelled from Wolsingham, through Harperley, Witton le Wear over Witton viaduct and on to Witton Park.
