




- Santa Specials 9 trains fully booked: 9 of the 20 scheduled trains are now fully booked and only approximately 700 of the 5,000 available tickets remain to be sold. These figures are as at November 24th and are well up on the same point last year and exceed the total final sales of 2007, advertising in the last week in the local press should further add to these totals. - Santa Extras: The following extra school specials will be run midweek over five days: Etherley(2), Wolsingham (2), Copton Hill(2), Howden le Wear, Woodland, Villa Real, Ebchester, Shotley Bridge, Crook Stanley. Last year there were 5 extra trains.(IG)
- Santa Haulage: As mentioned before a Class 31 (31452) will be coming to Weardale to assist in hauling the Santa Specials. It will be leaving Derby on the 27th November, time of arrival not yet confirmed. Driver training will commence after arrival. The first three trains over the weekend of November 29 and 30 will be covered by the 141 DMU. (GL)

- **Depot News:** The Class 73 (73139) has been receiving attention from a team of volunteers and specialists from RMS Locotec at who travelled to Wolsingham. At the last report they have the diesel engine running and are commencing to work on the electrics. We hope to know soon the full extent of the remaining work needed.(GL).
- Other Depot News: Work has also resumed on the restoration on the restoration of a privately owned and funded Mk 1 coach, which on completion will become the property of the Trust. Additionally a lighting system has been installed in the depot pit facilitating work on no 40 and other locos. The temporary wiring originally installed in 2004 to work off the generator has now been removed as the new mains wiring is now operational (GL, FH, S Rn)
- **No 40 :** Work is progressing well on the restoration all the lagging is in place and the cladding over the boiler likewise. Work continues on the running frame and smokebox.(S Rc)
