WEARDALE RAILWAY: NEWS UPDATE : No. 4 11 NOVEMBER 2008

- **Trackwork :** With the completion of the initial vegetation clearance along the track to within sight of Bishop Auckland station and the return of the motorised flail to its owners , work has commenced on some urgent repairs in the neighbourhood of Parson Byers on the existing open line. This area has been subject to flooding in the recent bad weather and the track teams have concentrated on completing the work, which involved removing the track and reballasting, prior to the Christmas season. Work will resume on repairing the track between Wolsingham and Bishop Auckland shortly. (GL)
- **2009 Timetable :** The timetable for 2009 has been agreed by the Railway Management and is being submitted to the printers as of the date of this news update. The pattern of services will be similar to last year, but with the intention to utilising steam haulage regularly from Easter onwards. (JA)
- **Stanhope Station:** The availability of new storage space at Stanhope has enabled volunteers (and Junior Club members) to clear out the Waiting Room and 'Old Shop'. It is planned to reopen the Old Shop as an overflow area for the Cafemuch needed at busy times such as the Santa season. (GL)
